

1. Student Numbers and Language Courses

2. Aboriginal Language Teacher Training Programs



Develop a program specific to teaching Indigenous languages in Manitoba



Develop and deliver joint Indigenous language teaching programs



Offer teacher training programs in Indigenous languages



Develop courses as a base for a new program proposal to Teaching Indigenous Languages



Adopt frameworks for recognizing Indigenous knowledge and body of work as credential equivalents

3. Aboriginal Language Programs

Develop frameworks for recognizing Indigenous knowledge and body of work as credential equivalents

Establish program laddering from certificate programs to bachelor degrees

Establish joint degree programs for Indigenous language teachers, language revitalization strategists/consultants, policy developers and analysts, linguistics, translators and transcribers

Meet community needs of schools offering Indigenous language courses or programs

4. Professional Development Sessions



Recognize former language and land-based experiences as well as other prior professional/training opportunities



Enhance training in the development of Aboriginal language yearly, unit and lesson planning



Develop Indigenous language benchmarks and K–12 language resources

5. Internal and External Partnerships (1/2)



Cooperation between instructors to make language lessons laddering equivalent



Joint degree or an articulation agreement between postsecondary institutions



Collaborate and partner with postsecondary institutions and First Nations
