Framework for Learning Professional Development Sessions

The Student Achievement and Inclusion Division began a series of professional learning sessions in spring 2023 to support a train-the-trainer implementation approach for Manitoba's <u>Framework for Learning</u>. The implementation sessions have continued this fall in Winnipeg, Selkirk, and Brandon, with over 250 educational leaders from across the province participating. Five sessions, each with a specific focus area, will be offered throughout the 2023/2024 school year. Sessions 1 and 2 have been held already. School division Framework for Learning liaisons have been scheduled to attend Sessions 3 to 5, which will be held throughout the rest of this school year in Winnipeg, Selkirk, and Brandon.

Spotlight: Canada-Manitoba ELCC Action Plan Update

The department has been working over the past year to build connections with the sector, stakeholders, and new partners in our work to advance Manitoba's commitments under two agreements with the Government of Canada: the <u>Canada-Manitoba Early Learning and Child Care Agreement</u> and the <u>Canada-Manitoba Canada-Wide Early Learning and Child Care Agreement</u>.

Much of what we learned through these engagements directly informed the negotiations with Canada for the final years of the two agreements. On August 1, 2023, these new action plans were jointly announced by the governments of Manitoba and Canada. They outline actions that Manitoba will undertake to achieve its commitments to strengthen the workforce, enhance quality, improve affordability, and create 23,000 additional spaces.

Early Childhood Educator Workforce Strategy

Early childhood educators (ECEs) and child care assistants (CCAs) are the foundation of quality early learning programs. The department estimates that at least 2,000 ECEs and 1,000 CCAs will be needed to support the expansion of spaces across Manitoba. While much work remains, several initiatives have been launched:

- 18% increase to funding to support increases to wages
- Multi-year training expansion plan to create almost 1,000 new training seats at universities and colleges
- Extension of the ECE Tuition Reimbursement Program until 2026

Qualified vendors are being contracted through competitive processes to support the implementation of a comprehensive framework for wages and benefits, and to modernize the certification system. Stakeholder consultation is planned for winter 2023. Additional strategies to recruit and retain professionals in the sector are in development, and Manitoba is working cross-jurisdictionally on a federal-provincial-territorial workforce strategy, as well as with the <u>Minister's Consultation Table</u>, which comprises providers and stakeholders.

Space and Capital Expansion

Towards the target of 23,000 newly funded early learning and child care spaces, as of August 2023, 8,266 spaces have been approved for children 0–6 years (opened or committed) leveraging federal funding. In addition, provincial funding has been invested to extend those supports to school-age programs, including approving an additional 4,272 spaces for children ages 7–12 (opened or committed). This brings the total opened or committed spaces to 12,498 spaces for children 0–12 years. In July 2023, with funding provided under the Canada-Manitoba Canada-Wide Early Learning and Child Care Agreement, Manitoba announced the allocation of \$132 million across 36 public schools to create more than 2,400 spaces for children under seven. Post-Secondary Program Expansion

Additional training opportunities are now available for ECEs and CCAs, as the governments of Manitoba and Canada are expanding post-secondary programs at five public universities and colleges. ECE II Assessment Program

The ECE II Assessment Program serves as a pathway for individuals to attain their ECE II classification. It is designed for those who are already equipped with the essential knowledge and skills required for child

care, utilizing Recognition of Prior Learning practices. There are four streams of ECE II Assessments available to participants: Competency-Based Assessment, Prior Learning Assessment, Modified Prior Learning Assessment, and Internationally Educated Qualifications. On June 22, 2023, the department celebrated and congratulated over 60 new professionals who received their ECE II certification. This was the first time since 2019 that an in-person event honouring ECE II graduates was held!

The Competency-Based Assessment stream for rural and northern participants has extended its intake deadline to November 30, 2023. This program is designed to support career advancement in early childhood education, offering CCAs the opportunity to become ECE IIs with guidance from an advisor and peer assessor.

K to 12 Certification Review

Manitoba Education and Early Childhood Learning has begun a review of the <u>Teaching Certificates and</u> <u>Qualifications Regulation</u>, which was last reviewed in 2015. This regulation establishes the requirements for the certification and recognition of the professional experience of teachers, school leaders, and school clinicians in the province. Consultations began in July 2023. Initial feedback from the sector resulted in interim amendments; however, in the coming weeks, the department will continue consultations and use this feedback to consider further amendments to the regulation.

Provincial Assessment Program Update

Manitoba's provincial assessment program has dual purposes. At the **school and divisional level**, data is used to provide feedback to students, teachers, and parents/caregivers regarding student learning, to inform instructional planning, and to help inform decisions, such as those related to the allocation of resources. At the **provincial level**, the data provides a snapshot of how students are doing in relation to specific learning outcomes at a specific point in time. This system-wide data assists in identifying trends and informs system-level policy decisions and the development, refinement, and implementation of provincial curriculum and assessments. Here are some important updates for the 2023/24 school year:

- A three-year pilot began in 2023/24 to implement the Early Years Evaluation assessment. This assessment provides real-time, student-specific data in Kindergarten to support responses to in-year learning needs with a focus on literacy skills and healthy childhood development. Thirty school divisions are participating in year one of the pilot.
- The Early Years and Middle Years formative assessments will continue as usual.
- The new Grade 10 Provincial Evaluation, focused on cumulative student learning to the end of Grade 9, is proceeding in November with a pilot across Manitoba schools. The evaluation is focused on the reading and responding component and mathematics component for students taking language arts and mathematics in the first semester. This pilot evaluation, developed with Manitoba teachers, will build system readiness and confidence for full implementation in fall 2024.
- Grade 12 Provincial Tests, suspended early during the COVID-19 pandemic, are scheduled to resume in January and June 2024.

Safe and Caring Schools: A Policy Directive Enhancing Proactive Supports to Minimize the Use of Suspension (2023)

We are pleased to announce the launch of the new *Safe and Caring Schools: A Policy Directive Enhancing Proactive Supports to Minimize the Use of Suspension.* This <u>policy directive</u> provides province-wide guidance to limit, reduce, and phase out exclusionary practices, except in situations of imminent safety risk to students and staff. It also provides school divisions with a framework to develop or renew their local policies on the use of suspension in schools by spring 2024. This policy directive ensures we meet an important recommendation from the Manitoba Advocate for Children and Youth (MACY).

Thank you to Mountain View and River East Transcona school divisions for piloting the collection of suspension and expulsion data in the 2022/2023 school year. The provincial suspension data pilot project will continue in 2023/2024, with all school divisions participating to further inform the collection process.

Provincial School Leadership Framework

Manitoba Education and Early Childhood Learning has worked with education sector partners to co-create a Provincial School Leadership Framework to guide professional learning of school leaders and build school leadership skills within local contexts. Last spring, the department released three surveys: a parent advisory council survey, a student advisory council survey, and a sector survey (school and school division leaders, teachers, Indigenous Rights Holders, and education partners), seeking feedback and validation on the identified skills, knowledge, and behaviours of effective school leadership. Survey results are summarized in a <u>What We Heard</u><u>Report</u>. The department thanks all who participated in the survey. Work continues to incorporate this feedback and finalize the framework, with support from Dr. Steven Katz, an implementation team, and a number of principal learning networks.

French Language Teacher Recruitment and Retention Strategy

Manitoba's Recruitment and Retention Strategy for French Language Teachers: Moving to Action was launched in June 2023. The strategy outlines a framework to coordinate numerous initiatives intended to increase the supply of French-language teachers in Manitoba. It includes a detailed implementation plan that outlines specific ways in which Manitoba sector partners and education stakeholders can move to collective action. The Bureau de l'éducation française will provide system-level leadership to support the implementation of the strategy in partnership with French education stakeholders. Consultations over the past several years greatly informed the development of the strategy and underscored the need for continued engagement and collaboration among government, stakeholders, and partners in the months and years to come.

Treaty Education for All

An exciting development for this school year is the <u>Treaty Education for All</u> plan, which launched in June 2023. This includes a requirement for all K to 12 school teachers and school staff to complete Treaty Education training by December 31, 2025, along with other focused work on supporting school leaders, establishing catalyst teacher learning networks in English and French, ensuring Treaty Education for K to 12 students, and planning for future developments with early learning and child care partners. School divisions will be submitting high-level implementation plans by October 31, 2023, as part of their reporting on the Framework for Continuous Improvement.

This plan builds upon the tremendous work of the Treaty Relations Commission of Manitoba (TRCM) and our education partners in the delivery of Treaty Education across the province. Thanks also to the catalyst teachers, school leaders, and school division partners for your work to ensure understanding of our shared history and responsibilities and for advancing Truth and Reconciliation.

Remote Learning

In the fall 2022 engagement sessions, it was mentioned that students and teachers are often unaware of the breadth of remote learning opportunities already in place to support student success in Manitoba, as referenced in the <u>Provincial Online High School: What We Heard Report (April 2023).</u> To increase awareness, a new user-friendly website has been created that will improve information on remote learning high school programming (see <u>www.mbremotelearing.ca</u>). The website reflects what has been learned from over 20 years of remote learning in Manitoba, two years of emergency remote learning during COVID-19, and what was heard through extensive stakeholder engagement, including engagement with the Student Advisory Council. The department continues to engage with key partners from across the province, including metro, rural, and northern school division representatives and the DSFM, to provide feedback on the provincial remote learning strategy and remote learning programming.
