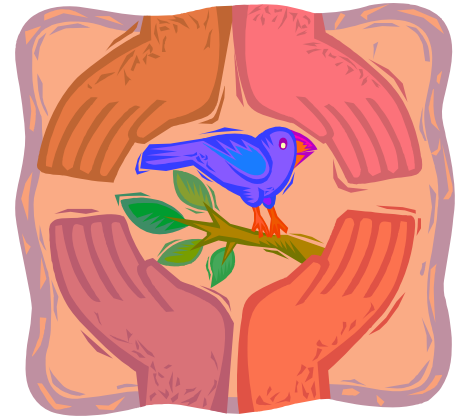


Humanitarian: a person who works to improve the lives of others or to reduce suffering in the world.
