Chiefs and champions series. [S.I.]: Tribute Films, c2004. DVDs (24 min. each): sd., col. SUMMARY: Introduces viewers to exceptional Aboriginal athletes who not only have become world class performers in their chosen sport, but also leaders in their communities. Audience: Grades 7 – 12.

- **Angela Chalmers.** SUMMARY: Ranked one of the top three female middle distance runners in the world, Angela competed in two Olympic Games and is a double gold medalist. She was inducted into both the BC and Manitoba Sports Hall of Fame. **Booking # D-11552**
- **Billy Two Rivers.** SUMMARY: Mohawk wrestler Billy became famous internationally in the 1960s then parlayed his experience in the political arena. Today he is a senior policy and political advisor to the National Chief of the Assembly of First Nations. **Booking # D-11557**
- **Fred Saskamoose.** SUMMARY: Fred Saskamoose, a Cree man, became the first status Indian to play in the NHL. Known for his deadly slap shot, Fred was sometimes called "the reluctant Blackhawk" because he almost refused a

Fred discusses the difficulty of overcoming his residential school experience, his battle with alcohol, and the work he now does to heal substance abuse in his community. **Booking # D-11556**

- **Gino Odjick.** SUMMARY: Gino made his NHL debut with the Vancouver Canucks and went on to become the league's top enforcer and fan favourite. Now speaking at workshops and conferences, he remains committed and focused on relaying his positive message to youth. **Booking # D-11554**

Electronic components: part III: thyristors, piezo crystals, solar cells, and fiber optics. Lawrenceville, NJ: Shopware, c2006. 1 DVD (23 min.): sd., col. + 1 teacher's guide. SUMMARY: Viewers learn about the basic construction and operation of such electronic components as photonic devices, solar cells, fiber optics and integrated circuits. Audience: Grades 9 – 12, Professional Development. **Booking # D-11289**

Endless fallout. Montreal: Macumba International, c2006. 1 DVD (52 min.): sd., col. SUMMARY: Told through narration, expert commentary, survivor accounts and archival footage, this program examines the gas leak at the Union Carbide India pesticide plant, the nuclear reactor explosion at Chernobyl and the oil spill caused by the Exxon Valdez.
