(e.g., program, text, planned units, and/or learning activities)

Language Arts: Completing Grade 2 Canadian Curriculum Press Reading and Writing Workbooks and will move onto the Grade 3 workbooks in the spring. Online resources such as Starfall, Khan Academy, etc. Library books from the local public library

Mathematics: Easy Peasey Math - 2 and Grade 2 *Hands-On Mathematics* with the goal to move into Grade 3 in the winter. Continue with Easy Peasy Math – 3 and Grade 3 *Hands-On Mathematics*. Using flash cards to learn math facts.

Science: Grade 3 Manitoba science curriculum, *Pearson Science 3* textbook and teacher's resource borrowed from the Manitoba Education Library. Integration of experiments, fieldtrips, books, technology and daily experiences.
