SCHOOL AND SCHOOL DIVISION

2007/08 AND 2008/09 PROVINCIAL REPORT

Planning and reporting continues to be a priority at all levels of education in Manitoba. Good planning and reporting lead to success for student learning. Schools and school divisions develop plans through school and community involvement, careful selection of strategies and the increasing use of data. The written plans are submitted to Manitoba Education, Citizenship and Youth (MECY) and reviewed on a three-year schedule. During the intervening years, schools and school divisions submit their current priority areas using a web survey.

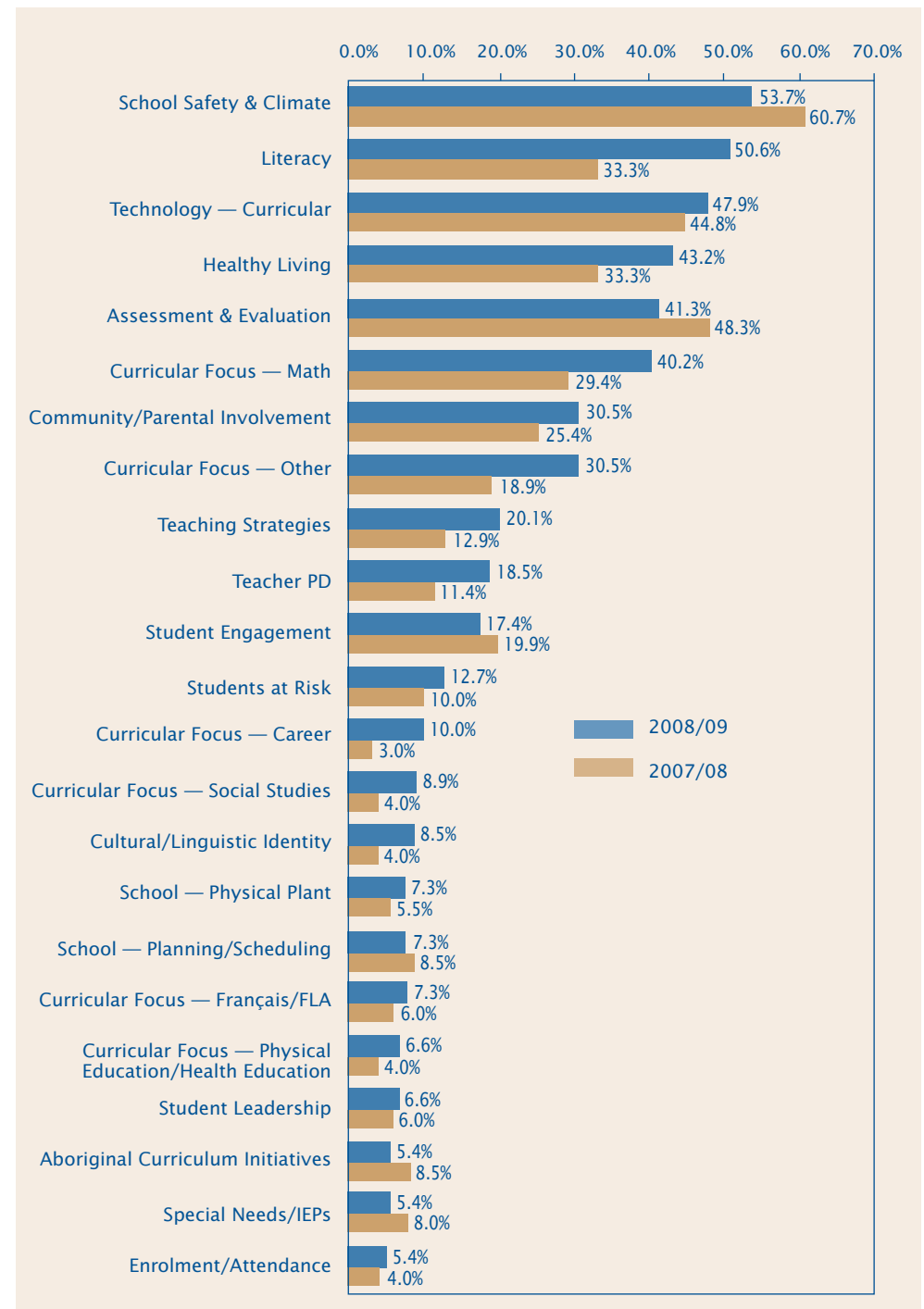
This is the third provincial report on the priorities chosen by schools and school divisions. It summarizes the information from the 2007/08 and 2008/09 school and school division reports. The information is provided to assist MECY, schools and school divisions with their future planning.

Priority Areas Identified by Schools and School Divisions

Information about priority areas from schools and school divisions on the following pages is collected in one of two ways: a written report or a web survey.

Chart I represents the priority areas provided by the one-third of schools submitting written plans to MECY during 2007/08 and 2008/09. The plans were received and reviewed by a MECY team.

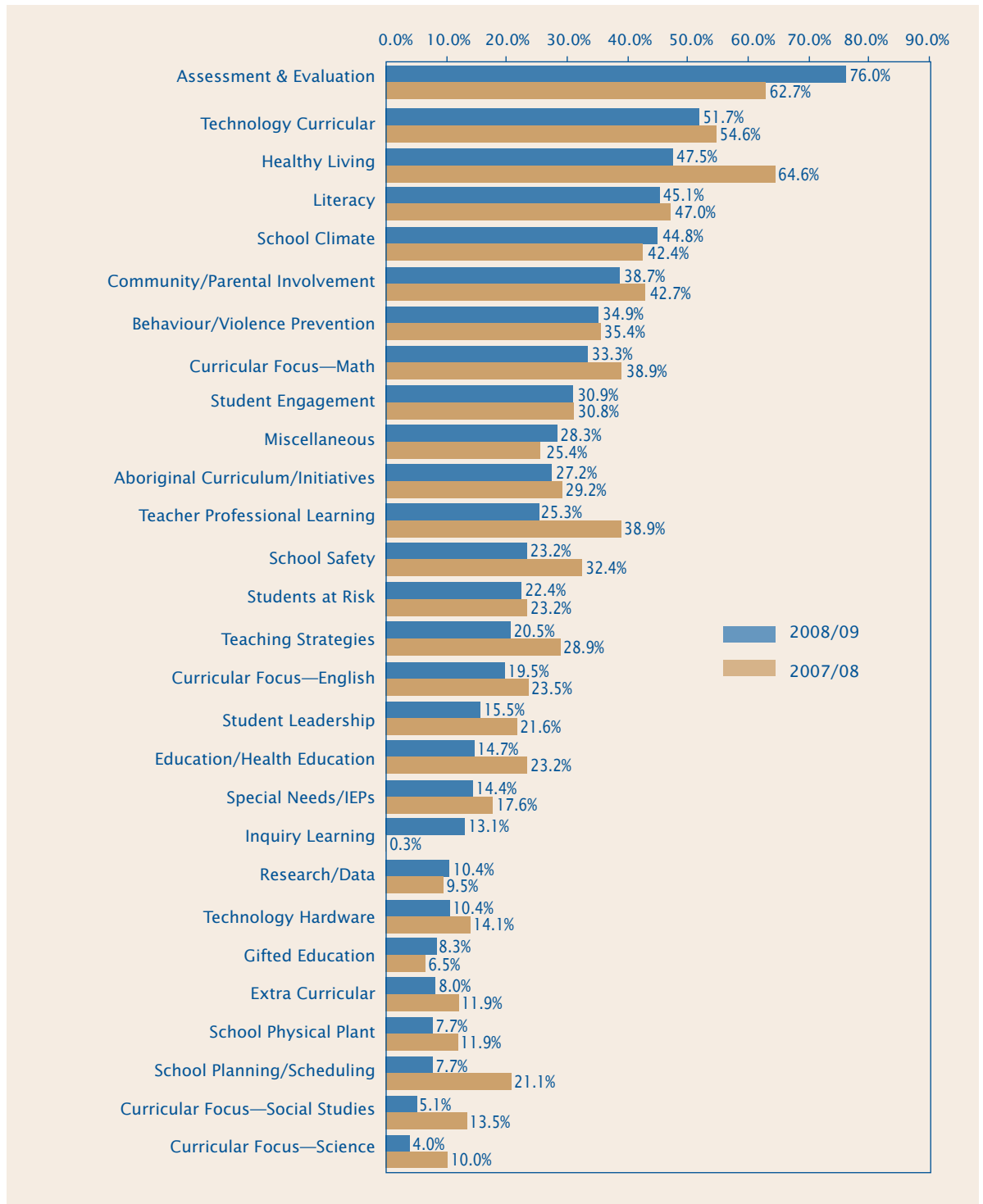
represents the priorities provided by the two-thirds of schools using the web survey during 2007/08 and 2008/09. The schools provided the information directly to the web survey.

The information from school reports represents one-third (written reports) and two-thirds (web surveys) of the approximately 700 schools from which MECY receives planning reports.

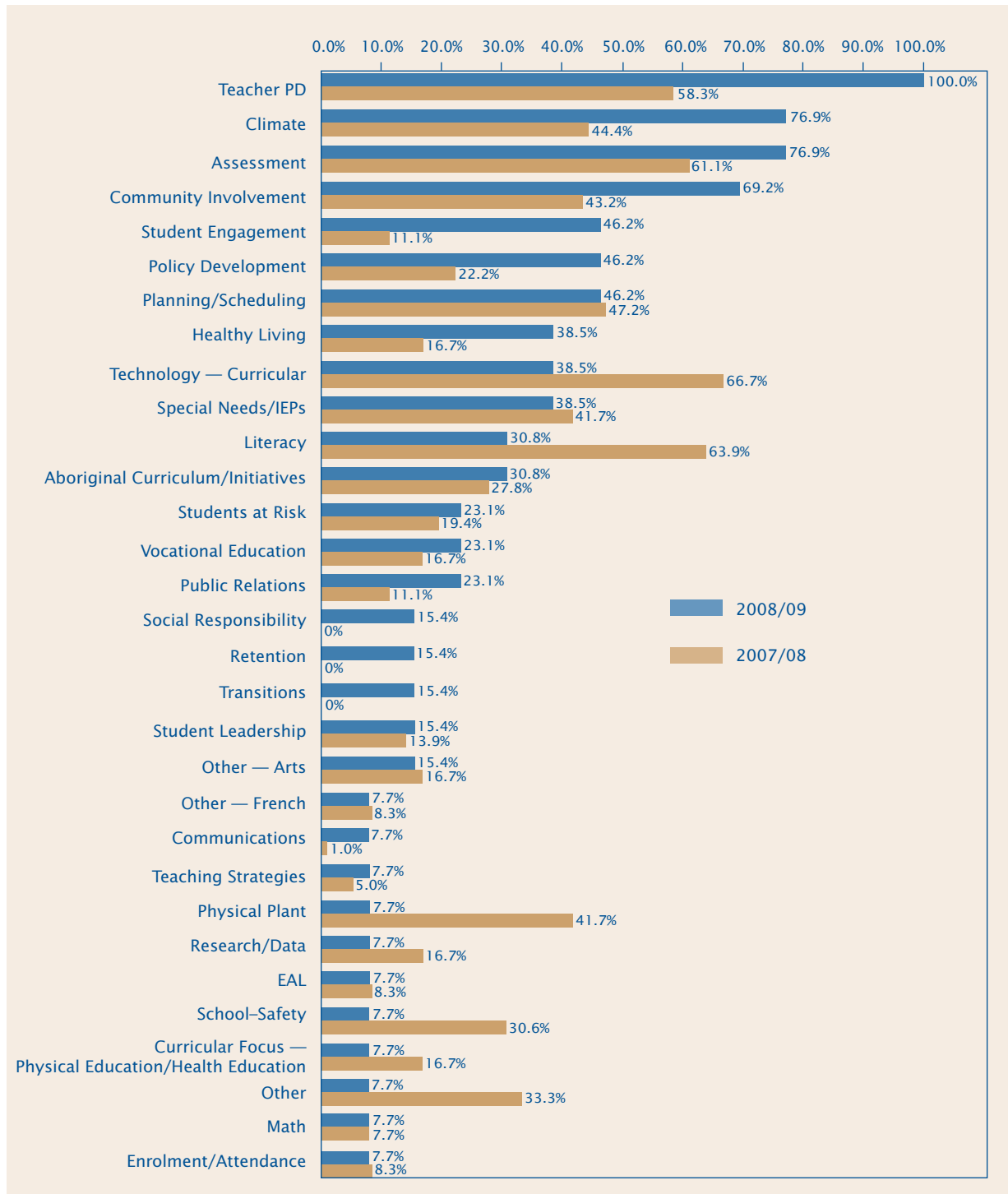
The information collected from school divisions represents one-third (written reports) and two-thirds (web survey) of reports from Manitoba's 37 school divisions.
