Large and Small Numbers

Material: A set of playing cards without 10s, jacks, queens, and kings.

Aces are worth 1 and jokers 0

OR

4 sets of digits cards (0 to 9)


Players: Two to four

Rules: Deal 6 cards to each player. The players place their cards

face up on the table. The object of the game is to make the smallest 3-digit number and the largest 3-digit number

possible with the cards they have. For example, with the

cards below, possible numbers are:



The player in the group who makes the largest number gets a point, as does the player who makes the smallest number. The first player who gets 8 points wins the game.

Note to parents:

When you play Largest and Smallest Numbers with your child, encourage him to read the numbers aloud.
