- Pierre-Esprit Radisson (1636 1710) French explorer and voyageur, independent fur trader, advisor to the Hudson's Bay Company
- Thanadelthur (1697 1717) Dene woman, interpreter, peace negotiator
- Henry Kelsey (1667 1724) English explorer of the Plains, employee of the Hudson's Bay Company
- Pierre Gaultier de Varennes, sieur de la Vérendrye (1685 1749) Military officer, Canadian farmer, fur trader, explorer of Manitoba territory
- Samuel Hearne (1745 1792) English explorer of the Arctic, fur trader, employee of the Hudson's Bay Company
- George Simpson (1787 1860) Scottish merchant and businessman, Governor of the Hudson's Bay Company
- Alexander Mackenzie (1764 1820) Scottish fur trader, explorer of the North, writer, employee of the Hudson's Bay Company and later the North West Company
- David Thompson (1770 1857) Fur trader, explorer of the West, mapmaker, employee of the Hudson's Bay Company and later the North West Company
- Thomas Douglas, Earl of Selkirk (1771 1820) Scottish landowner, colonizer, founder of the Red River Colony
- Simon Fraser (1776 1862) U.S.-born Canadian explorer of the West, fur trader for the North West Company, farmer
- James McGill (1744 1813) Scottish-born Canadian merchant, landowner, partner in the North West Company, Montréal patron
