1. Mindfulness	Find a place with some open space. Use three contact points on the floor
	and balance calmly for 10 seconds. After a rest, try another pose using 2
	points of contact, breathing calmly for 10 seconds. Try one more balance
	with only 1 point of contact (such as one foot). To help, focus your gaze
	on a spot on a wall does calming your breath help you hold the balance?
2. Photography	Fold a small piece of paper in half. Using a pencil, try to draw some lines
Challenge 1	on one side of the paper. Pretend the opposite side of the paper is a
(Home studio)	mirror. Try to draw the exact same lines in a way that creates a
	symmetrical looking graphic image.
	Let's try again using 4 paper squares. Can you make a pattern on one
	square and accurately repeat it on the other three? Now arrange the tiles
	into a larger square. Explore both symmetrical and asymmetrical layouts.
