9126: Knitwear Design and Construction 30S/30E/30M

Course Description

This course gives an overview of knitwear techniques. Students study the anatomy, theory, and evolution of knitwear. Students will design and create knitwear garments incorporating techniques from the sewing and patternmaking portfolio created.
