A Hairstyling Course

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Course Description

This course focuses on honing their skills and timing in barbering, haircutting, thermal styling, roller setting, colour and foil application, and perm winding to prepare students for their Manitoba Hairstylist Practical Examination. Students learn all of Unit H3: Pre-Interprovincial Exam Review and Unit H4: In-School Hairstylist Practical Exam in this course.
