Completing the Homeschooling Progress Report

Homeschooling Progress Reports are the official educational record for each homeschooled child and are filed in the Homeschooling Office. These records may support future enrolment in school or application to a post-secondary institution.

Homeschooling parents are required to submit progress reports for each child in January and June of each homeschooling year. You can submit January or June Homeschooling Progress Reports using the online form or contacting the Homeschooling Office for a paper form.

On the Progress Reports, comments become the permanent record about how a child is doing within each subject area contributing to a complete homeschooling record. Parents may assign number or letter grades, but it is not necessary. If a parent is using structured curricula, they can note the units that are completed.
