

# SCHOOL AND SCHOOL DIVISION PLANNING AND PRIORITIES

## 2005/06 AND 2006/07 PROVINCIAL REPORT

Planning and reporting play an important role at all levels of education in Manitoba. As one of the priorities of the Manitoba K–12 Education Agenda for Student Success, strengthening planning and reporting continues to be a focus for Manitoba Education, Citizenship and Youth (MECY).

Effective planning and reporting contribute to successful student learning. All schools and school divisions in Manitoba develop annual public plans and reports. MECY reviews school and school division priorities to help guide its own planning.

This is the second provincial report on the priorities chosen by schools and school divisions. It summarizes information from the 2005/06 and 2006/07 school and school division reports. The information is provided to assist MECY, schools and school divisions with their future planning.

### Priority Areas Identified by Schools and School Divisions

The provincial summary of priorities is an important indicator of what is important to schools and school divisions. The information guides MECY in developing its own priorities.

**Figure 1 — Manitoba Priorities Identified by Schools for 2006/07 (Ranked) and 2005/06**

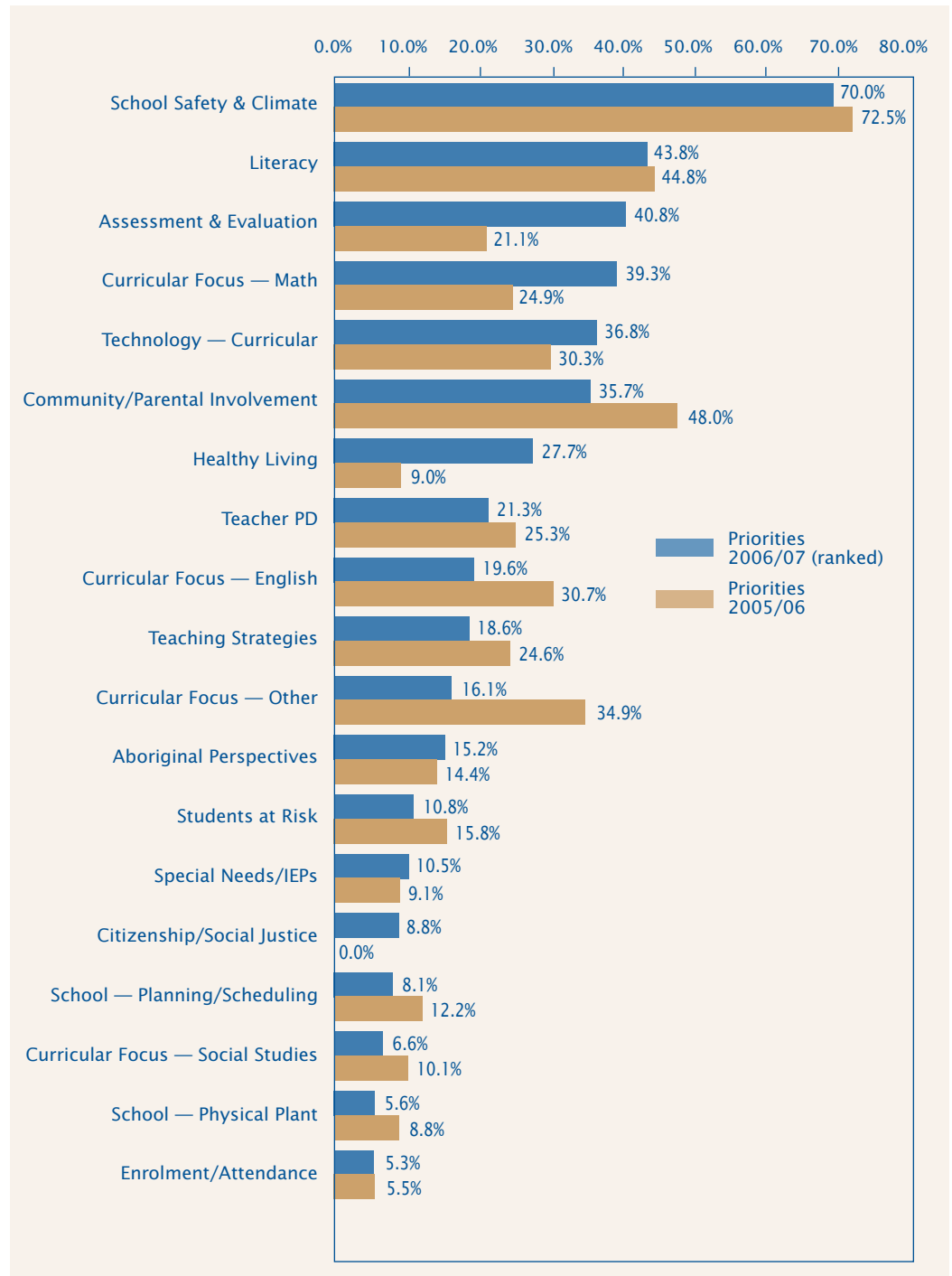
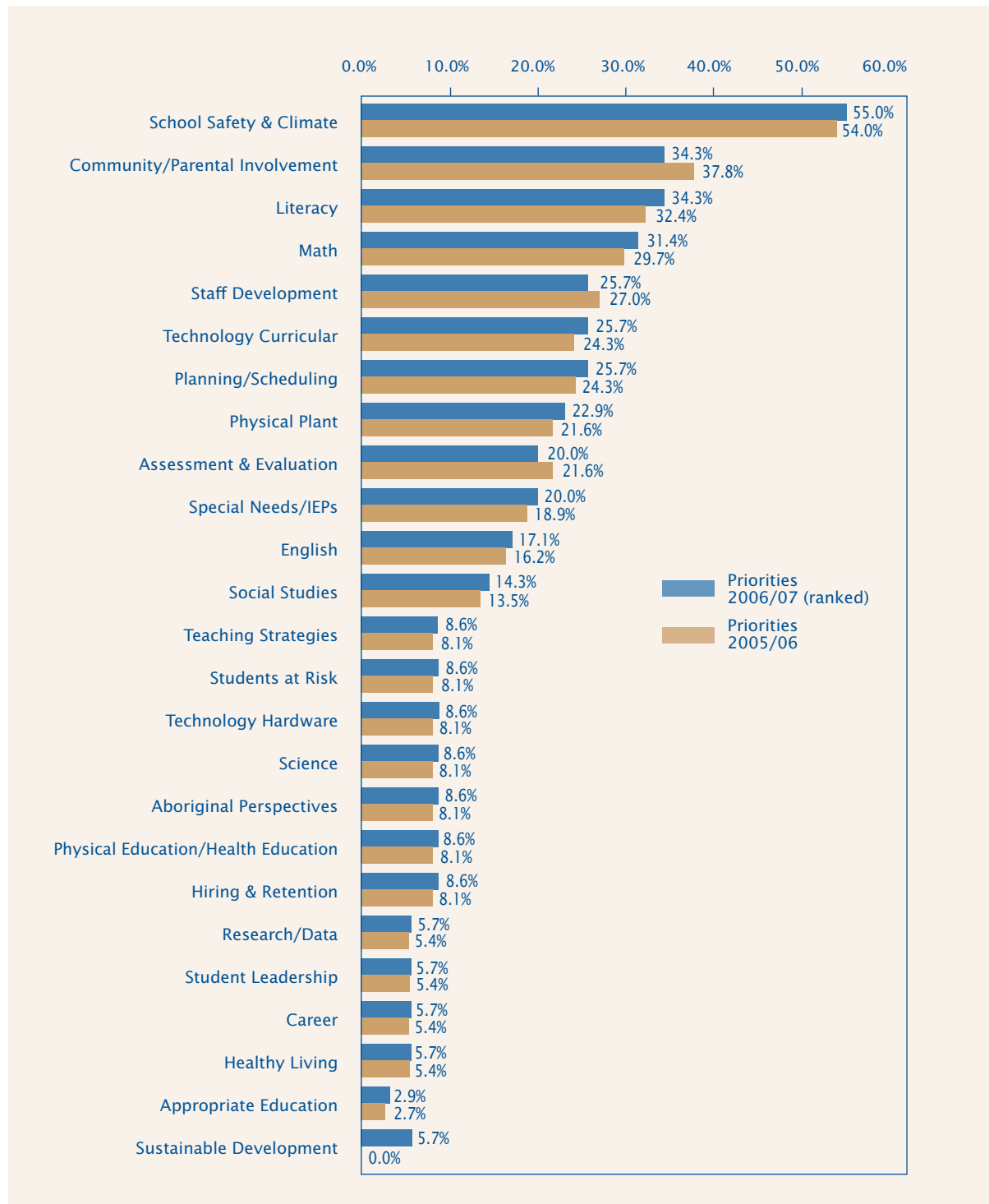


Figure 2 shows the priority areas that were targeted by school divisions for the 2005/06 and 2006/07 school years.

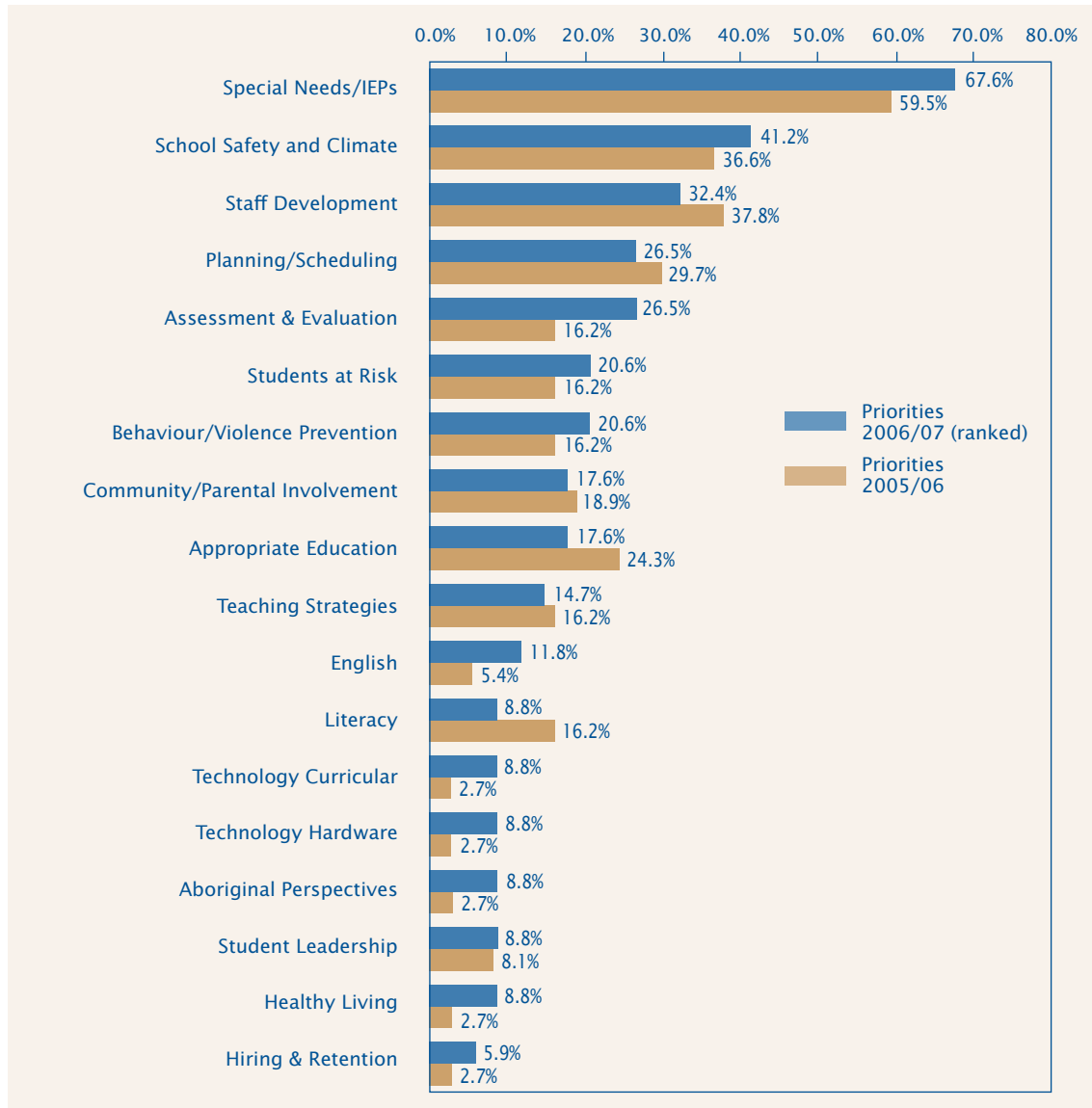
**Figure 2 — Manitoba School Division Priorities 2006/07 (Ranked) & 2005/06**
