Reported student enrolment from most regions decreased in 2009/10. This is due to the lack of response from the University of Winnipeg and the prevalence of con-current enrolment in other post-secondary programs as reported by the University of Manitoba English Language Centre. However, even with the overall reduction of 573 reported international students, there was stronger representation from Africa and South America in 2009/10.

The objective is to estimate the incremental expenditures made in Manitoba by international ESL students. Expenditures are of two types, "Living Expenditures" and "Tuition & Educational Fees". "Total Estimated Manitoba Based Expenditures" is the sum of these.

(1) "Estimated Student Living Expenditures" is the product of Total Weeks of Enrolment multiplied by Average Weekly Student Expenditures (sourced to Human Resources & Social Development Canada).

(2) "Tuition & Educational Fees Paid" is as reported to the Manitoba International Education Branch of Manitoba Intergovernmental Affairs & Trade.

(3) Marked reduction in "Estimated Student Living Expenditures" for 2009/10, in comparison to the relatively small reduction in "Tuition & Educational Fees Paid", is due to prevalence of con-current enrolment in other post-secondary programs as reported by the University of Manitoba English Language Centre. Living expenditures for these students will be accounted for in the Post-Secondary International Student Survey Report for 2009/10.
