Key Priority for School/Division Staff: Establishing a Sense of Physical Safety in School Spaces

This support guide contains resources, protocols, and guidelines that can help to promote the physical safety of staff and students in Kindergarten to Grade 12 schools. It is meant for school principals, teachers, clinicians, support staff, maintenance, and transportation staff and anyone else working within school/division spaces.

The COVID-19 pandemic is ongoing and what we know about COVID-19 is changing, which can contribute to uncertainty when it comes to promoting physical safety in school environments. Along with taking care of our mental health, there are many things we can do to promote our physical safety in schools.

Manitoba COVID-19 Testing and Information

Manitoba's COVID-19 testing approach has evolved based on public health evidence. Testing eligibility criteria have expanded to guide the province's response. Presently, anyone with symptoms of COVID-19 is eligible for testing.

■ Shared Health Manitoba COVID-19 Screening Tool: This tool is not a medical assessment and does not substitute for consulting with your doctor. It can be used to determine if you should contact Health Links or seek other medical advice. This tool is regularly updated and allows individuals to ascertain whether further intervention is needed based on their responses.
