

Other Credit Options in French Immersion

In addition to the courses offered in French by the school, students may also consider taking the following credit options in order to obtain the minimum 10 credits:

* Schools must register these courses through the Bureau de l'éducation française for French credit.

There are also [half-credit options in career development \(CD\)](#) that can be offered simultaneously with other courses taught in French in the classroom. A French CD half-credit may be earned once a student or a group of students achieve its learning outcomes along with those of the other course. Up to four CD half-credits may be obtained in high school, a half credit per grade level.

Furthermore, students may take the following [web-based courses offered in French:](#) *Physique* (30S and 40S) and *Éducation physique et Éducation à la santé* (30F and 40F). This distance learning web-based option involves a teacher from the school or school division who structures the course so that the student completes the work independently, at his or her own pace, but within timelines established by the teacher.
