## 9064: INTRODUCTION TO ESTHETICS (10) 20S/20E/20M

### **Course Description**

This course introduces students to nail technology and skin care technology. It is a course for both professions, containing common elements from each.

Students in this course are required to describe some introductory nail and skin care services. They are **not** required to demonstrate procedures in the area in which the teacher is not certified. For example, a teacher who is a certified nail technician but not a certified skin care technician is not required to have students demonstrate skin care procedures, and vice versa.
