8313 BASIC HAIRSTYLING (10B) 20S/20E/20M

Course Description

This course focuses on the properties of the hair and scalp, wet hair styling techniques, formal up-dos, shampoos, conditioners, rinses, and treatments. Students will learn to conduct hair and scalp analyses. They will also be introduced to Afro texture hair and other natural hair types. Students learn all of Unit A2: Hair and Scalp Analysis in this course.
