# 8318 INTERMEDIATE HAIRSTYLING AND ARTIFICIAL HAIR (11C) 30S/30E/30M

#### Course Description

This course focuses on wigs and hair enhancements, with the continued development of wet and thermal hair styling techniques, including Afro texture hair and other natural hair types, as well as advanced braiding techniques. Students learn all of Unit E1: Wigs, Hairpieces, and Hair Extensions in this course.
