1 white vinyl eraser	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• 1 eraser</li> </ul>
1 set of pencil crayons	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Set of 8</li> </ul>
1 glue stick	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• No substitution</li> </ul>
paint brushes a variety of sizes	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Round or flat</li> </ul>
a camera, digital or with colour film	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Several disposable cameras</li> </ul>
a bottle of white glue	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• No substitution</li> </ul>
a portfolio 45.7 x 61 cm or 18" x 24"	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Create your own with 2 sheets of cardboard</li> </ul>
a sketch book with 50 to 75 pages	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• 22.9 x 30.5 cm or 9" x 12"</li> </ul>
Mayfair paper *	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Any stiff paper or Bristol board</li> </ul>
cartridge paper *	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Smooth, medium weight white paper</li> </ul>
water colour paper *	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Cream manila paper</li> </ul>
rice paper *	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Any semi-transparent paper</li> </ul>
