Pride Parades are held all over the world in communities where LGTBQ2A+ individuals feel safe expressing and celebrating their identities, which were historically oppressed. Recently, many parade organizers have requested an absence of police, or at a bare minimum, an absence of police in uniform due to the historical accounts of police-executed abuse towards LGTBQ2A+ individuals (Canadian Press).
