


THE DUKE OF EDINBURGH'S INTERNATIONAL AWARD

The Duke of Edinburgh's International Award is a flexible, non-competitive, voluntary program available to all young people from 14 to 24 years of age, whatever their background or ability. The Award program encourages young people to develop positive skills and lifestyle habits, perform community services, and participate in physical activities. The hours that Manitoba students accumulate through community service, cultural exploration, and physical activity participation in the Duke of Edinburgh's International Award program can be used to fulfill the following requirements:
