

Notifying for Homeschooling

Access the Homeschool Forms on the web page.



When parents choose to homeschool, they must notify the Homeschooling Office annually of their intent by completing a **Student Notification Form** for each child. When using the online forms, families save time and a declaration replaces the need for ink signatures.

To submit notification or progress report forms online, click <u>Homeschool Forms</u>.



Parents who prefer a paper copy of the Student Notification Form can contact the Homeschooling Office. The **Contacts** link on the web page provides phone and toll-free numbers, and email and mailing addresses. Parents can also communicate with a homeschooling Liaison Officer who supports homeschooling families. Parents can consult with a Liaison Officer when planning Program Outlines and can share information about online, print-based, and faith-based resources.

If you homeschooled the previous school year and plan to continue for the upcoming school year, you must notify the Homeschooling Office by **September 1** of each school year.

NOVEMBER

Parents new to homeschooling or withdrawing their child from school must notify within **30 days** of beginning to homeschool. If you start homeschooling within a school year, for example on November 5, you have 30 days from that date to submit the required Notification Forms, for example, by December 5.


Program Outline

Homeschool parents are responsible for researching, choosing, and acquiring the materials and resources to support each child's programming in each subject area. Varieties of print and online resources are available to support homeschool programs. When developing a program of studies and setting learning goals, consider each child's interests, skills, and abilities. Providing a wide range of resources encourages student engagement in learning.

On the Homeschooling web page, parents will find information for planning and resources, as well as samples.



Once you have completed your research and have chosen your resources, you are ready to fill in the Program Outline.



The Program Outline should include topics, concepts, and units of study, in addition to the titles or names of the main resources families have chosen. The space is limited on the online or paper form; parents may attach another document to complete the details.

When all requirements are met, families receive a Confirmation of Notification letter, which includes the homeschooling family number. This official document confirms you are a homeschooling family with the Province of Manitoba for the current school year. Retain the letter as the family number is needed to complete future forms.
